UKRAINE

(re)appeared on the political map of Europe in 1991, after the collapse of the USSR

The largest country located entirely within Europe (603,550 km²)

Population as of 2022, before the war escalated, was estimated to amount to around 41 million inhabitants








Almost 70% of population live in cities and towns (estimates as of early 2022)

Education in Ukraine

- important in the eyes of society
- receiving higher education is considered to be important (2018 – 76% of school graduates applied to the institutions providing higher education)
- external independent exam (mandatory since 2008)

Challenges

- receiving higher education abroad has increasingly become more common (Poland, Czech Republic...)
- comparatively low social status of school teachers
- old methods of teaching in schools











2016 - begining of a major school reform



THE NEW SCHOOL FORMULA CONSISTS OF NINE KEY ELEMENTS:

- /01 New educational content based on enabling the competencies necessary for successful self-fulfillment in society.
- /02 Motivated teaching staff who enjoy freedom of creativity and professional development.
- /03 A cross-cutting educational process that informs values.
- /04 Decentralization and effective administration that will bring real autonomy to schools.
- /05 Teaching based on partnerships between the pupil, the teacher and parents.

- /06 A focus on pupil's needs in the educational process, i.e. child-centered education.
- /07 A new school structure that allows to master the new content and acquire life competencies.
- /08 Fair allocation of public funds that ensures equal access to quality education for all children.
- /09 A contemporary educational environment that will provide necessary conditions, means, and technology for education of pupils, teachers, and parents, not only in the premises of the educational establishment.



THE NEW UKRAINIAN SCHOOL









Education Governance

- The Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine is the highest body responsible for education
- The Law of Ukraine on Education (2017); The Law of Ukraine on General Secondary Education (2020)
 - State Service of Education Quality (SSEQ)
 - Ukrainian Center for Education Quality Assessment (UCEQA)
 - Ukrainian Institute of Education Development (UIED)
 - Institute of Modernisation of Education Content (IMEC)
- Regional departments of education in each oblast'
- Directorates of education in each community

School System in Ukraine

"the complete general secondary education is mandatory and is achieved in institutional or individual forms determined by the law, as a rule, at institutions of education" (Law on general secondary education, 2020)

Pre-2018:11 years of school

After the New Ukrainian School reform: 12 years of school





Schooling and COVID-19

COVID-19: children / teenagers were not vaccinated












Assessment / Grading

Formative assessment – in primary schools; introduced in secondary schools









TEMPORARY SOLUTIONS FOR STUDYING IN UKRAINE

Important to make room for refugee children to make use of distant learning opportunities in Ukraine:

- Own school in Ukraine (they need to re-establish contacts with their school, flexible solutions)
- Apply to the International Ukrainian School for distant learning (екстернат на індивідуальній основі) https://uis.org.ua
- Learn individually by using resources from the All-Ukrainian School Online (no certificate will be awarded) https://lms.e-school.net.ua
- Apply to private Ukrainian online schools for free https://mon.gov.ua/.../distancijni-shkoli-ta-navchalni...
- Join TV lessons held according to the new All-Ukrainian Curriculum (more info)
- Apply to local Ukrainian schools (the Ellisiv school in Oslo), that follows the Ukrainian curriculum and awards official certificates via partnership with the International Ukrainian School
- Join Ukrainian Sunday schools that provide teaching in Ukrainian language and culture, to keep social contacts with other Ukrainians (Kobzar school in Oslo)

Computer science

Primary and secondary school as a compulsory subject

High school - elective subject

After pandemic distance learning - familiarity with online learning tools (Google Classroom, Microsoft Teams, Zoom etc)







Computer labs



1 hour/week in specialized lab
Usually with shared desktops (it has pros and cons)

Desks for writing/teamwork

Textbooks for every grade, every student

Information. Data. Modelling

Searching, submitting, transforming, analyzing, generalizing and organizing data, and critically evaluating information to solve real-life problems

Digital Creativity

Creating information products and applications to effectively solve problems, express yourself individually and collaboratively, with and without digital devices

Digital Devices

Conscious use of information and communication technologies and digital devices to access information, communicate and collaborate as a creator and / or consumer, and master new ones

Safety and responsibility

Awareness of the consequences of the use of information technologies for ourselves, society, the world and sustainable development, observance of ethical, intercultural and legal norms of informational interaction





Secondary school curriculum

Computer use skills (Microsoft Office or similar)

Search skills (find information and critically evaluate it)

Some programming skills (Scratch, Python, Lazarus)

Narrow topics: Graphics, WebDesign, 3D modelling, DB intro







FIGURE 3. SCHOOL LEAVERS AND KEY COMPETENCIES MATHEMATICAL SCIENCE AND LITERACY **TECHNOLOGY** CULTURE DIGITAL LITERACY PERSONALITY INNOVATOR **ENVIRONMENT** AND HEALTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP PATRIOT MOTHER AND LIFELONG LEARNING -NATIONAL LANGUAGES SOCIALITY **FOREIGN LANGUAGES**

English at Primary School (1st – 4th Grades)

- ✓ 2-5 lessons per week.
- ✓ Duration: 1st Grade offline 35 min, online 30 min.
 2nd- 4th Grades offline 40 min, online 30 min.
- ✓ A common **number of Ss**: up to 14 Ss, in some cases 15-27 Ss
- ✓ Expected CEFR level: 4th Grade **A1**.







English at Secondary School (5th – 11th Grades)

- ✓ 2-5 lessons per week.
- ✓ **Duration**: offline 45 min, online 30-40 min.
- ✓ A common **number of Ss**: up to 14 Ss, in some cases 15-27 Ss
- ✓ Expected CEFR level: 9th Grade **A2**. 11th Grade **B1**







English at Primary School (1st – 4th Grades)

In Focus: Competency Approach.

- Communicative and Game-Based Learning.

Activities: games, community and research projects, experiments, group assignments, team etc.

CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning)

Formative Assessment (ClassDojo)







English at Secondary School (5th – 9th Grades)

Most Students must have been familiar with and used the following:

- Google Meet, Zoom, Microsoft Teams and other tools for online conferencing;
- Google Classroom, Moodle and other LMS platforms.

- online boards Padlet, Linoit etc.




