2020 vs 2019

10 460 teachers, teacher trainers, school principals and young people received training and professional development in citizenship and human rights education

337 trainings, local projects and awareness raising actions conducted by our multipliers to promote democracy, human rights and citizenship

73 473 teachers, parents, students and community actors reached

40 online trainings for trainers organized



Contributing to education policy

In **12** countries EWC works in close cooperation with national education authorities, including Ministries of Education and National Education Institutions

50 inputs delivered to policy makers providing expertise as well as evidence and lessons from education practice

10 expert groups run by international organizations such as the Council of Europe and UNESCO, to which EWC contributed with advice, expertise for policy development and better implementation

Building inclusive and democratic learning environments

300 primary and secondary schools across Europe worked in our programs on more inclusive and democratic policies and practices

80 higher education institutions, teacher training centers and NGOs benefited from capacity building programs

644 school visits and workshops run online and face-to-face to support schools in transforming their school life

6 university courses with a focus on practice-oriented teaching promoting citizenship, democracy and human rights in pre-service education developed

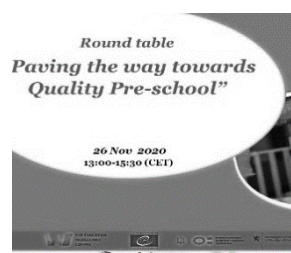
